## 1.1. Product Overview

TP-Link's Powerline Wi-Fi Extender is a combined wired/wireless network expansion device. With the help of your home's existing electrical circuitry, it can extend your Wi-Fi to wherever you want in your house.

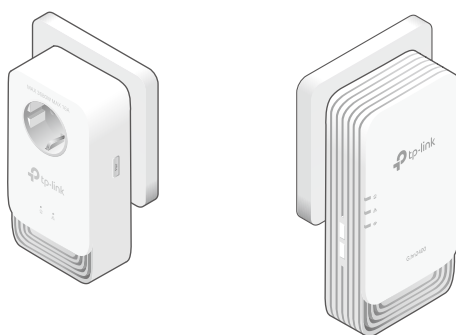
With Ethernet ports and built-in antennas, the powerline Wi-Fi extender provides wired and wireless access for multiple computers and mobile devices.




With various features and functions, the powerline Wi-Fi extender is the perfect choice for your home or business network.

## 1.2. Product Appearance

Your powerline extender may differ in appearance slightly from that depicted because of the region and product version.

■ Note: The European version is used for demonstration in this User Guide.

## Wi-Fi Button

Press for 1 second to start copying Wi-Fi settings from the router.

Press and hold for about 5 seconds to turn Wi-Fi on or off.

## Pair Button

Press and hold for 1 second to set up or join a secure powerline network.

Press and hold the Pair button for at least 6 seconds, then release the button to reset the adapter/extender to default settings.

## Ethernet Port

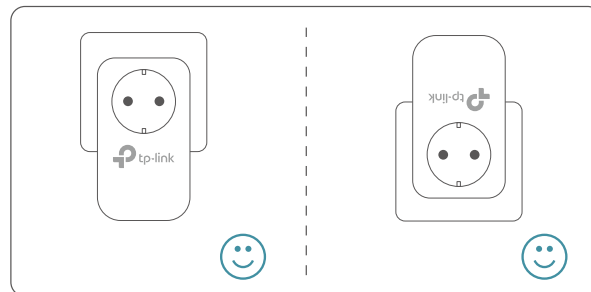
Connect the Ethernet ports to your wired devices, such as a computer, a router or a game console, via Ethernet cables.

## Integrated Electrical Socket

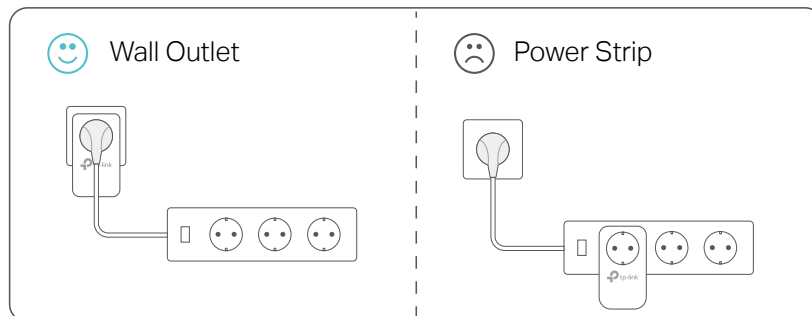
Used as a pass-through AC outlet to power other devices. It also reduces some electrical noise that may interfere with powerline performance.

2. Plug the product directly into a wall socket instead of a power strip.





## Chapter 2

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# Initial Use


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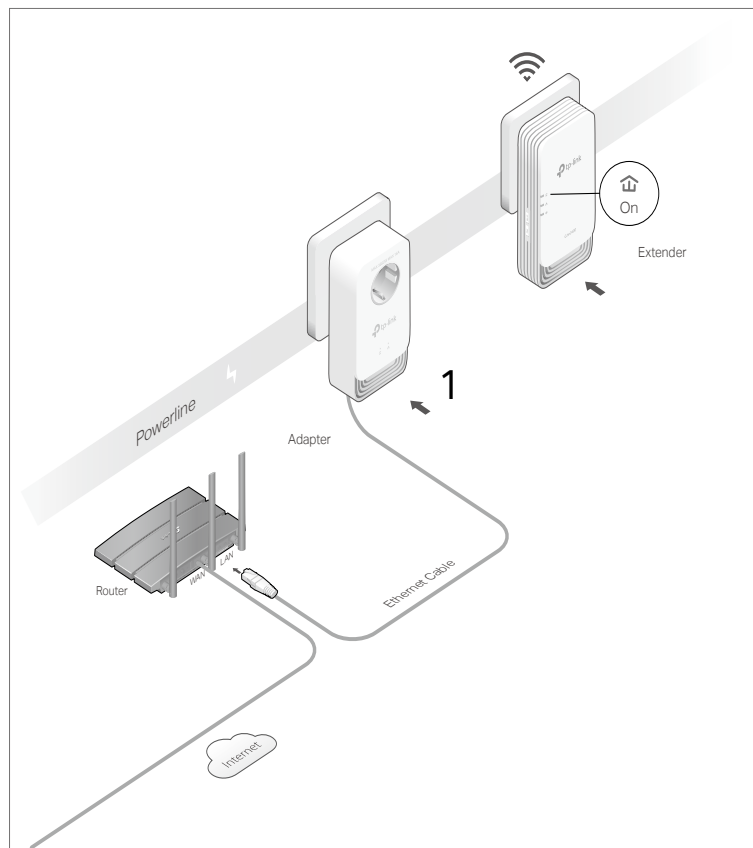
This chapter guides you on how to use the powerline extender when you first open the package.

You can Use the Powerline Wi-Fi Kit to set up a new secure wireless network in my house. For example, I have a wireless router in my house, but the wireless signal cannot reach every corner. So I bought a Powerline Wi-Fi Kit to extend the wireless network. The Powerline Wi-Fi Kit includes a powerline adapter and a powerline extender.

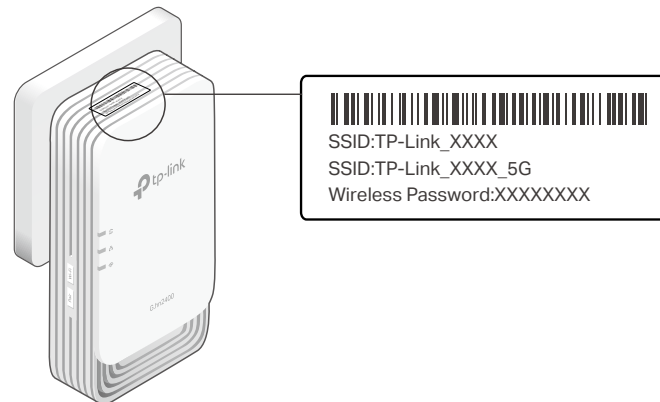
**Note:** G.hn devices are not compatible with HomePlug AV and AV2 Standard Powerline adapters.

### Method 1: Plug and Play

1. Connect the powerline adapter to an available LAN port of the router.
2. Plug the powerline adapter into a wall socket.
3. Plug the powerline extender into a wall socket near the adapter. Wait until the extender's Powerline LED  turns solid green.




4. Relocate the new extender to the Wi-Fi "dead" zone. Connect your devices to the internet using the SSIDs (network name) and password printed on the label at the side of the extender.

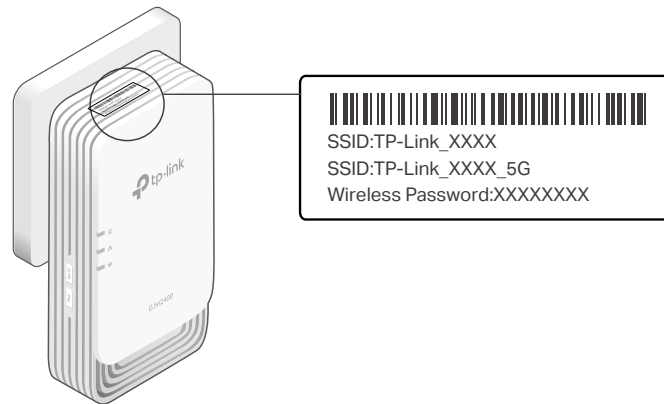
Now enjoy the internet with the SSIDs and password printed on the label!

## Method 2: Pairing

1. Connect the powerline adapter to an available LAN port of the router.
2. Plug the powerline adapter into a wall socket.
3. Plug the powerline extender into a wall socket near the adapter.
4. Pair the powerline devices.
  - a . Press the Pair button of the powerline adapter for 1 second. The Powerline LED should start blinking green.
    - Note: If the Powerline LED does not blink, press the Pair button again.
  - b . (Within two minutes) press the Pair button of the powerline extender for 1 second. The Power LED should start blinking. When the extender's Powerline LED  turns solid green, the pairing process is done!



5. Relocate the new extender to the Wi-Fi "dead" zone. Connect your devices to the internet using the SSIDs (network name) and password printed on the label at the side of the extender.



## Done!

Now enjoy the internet with the SSIDs and password printed on the label!

## 3. 1. Management Interface

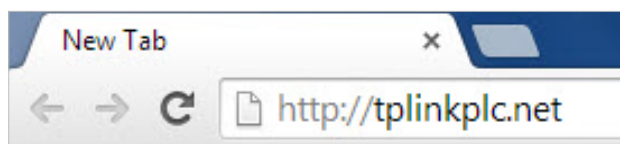
### 3. 1. 1. Log In

There are two methods to log in to the management interface.

- **Method 1: Via web browser**

Follow the steps below:


1. Connect your device to the powerline extender wirelessly.
2. Launch a web browser and type in <http://tplinkplc.net> to open the management interface.



3. Create a password for future login attempts.

- **Method 2: Via tpPLC utility**

Follow the steps below:

1. Connect your computer to the powerline extender via an Ethernet cable or wirelessly.
2. Obtain and install the tpPLC Utility from the product's Support page at <https://www.tp-link.com>.
3. Open the utility, move your mouse over your powerline extender, and click the  icon that appears beside it.
4. Create a password for future login attempts.

- **Method 3: Via tpPLC app**

Follow the steps below:

1. Get the tpPLC app from the Apple App Store or Google Play, or simply scan the QR code.

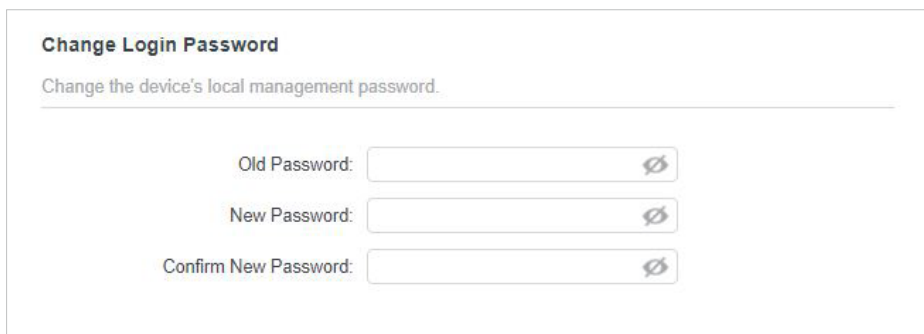


2. Connect your device to the powerline extender wirelessly.
3. Launch the tpPLC app and find the model of your device.
4. Manage your powerline extender as needed.

### 3. 1. 2. Change the Login Account

Follow the steps below to change the account.

1. Go to [System > Administration](#).
2. Follow instructions on the page to set a new password. A strong password should be at least 8 characters in length, combining uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers and punctuations.

## 3. 2. Manage Powerline Network

A powerline network is formed of powerline devices, including adapters and extenders. Powerline devices in the same powerline network share the same powerline network name.

### 3. 2. 1. Change Powerline Network Name

You can change the extender's powerline network name to add it to or remove it from a powerline network.

Follow the steps below to change the name.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to [Powerline > Powerline Settings](#).

**Note:** You can set up a powerline network by pushing the Pair button, using the [Soft Pair](#) feature, or manually setting the same powerline network name for each device.

3. Change the [Powerline Network Name](#). You can also click [Reset Powerline Defaults](#) to use the default network name, e.g. HomePlugAV. However, if the default name is used, the Wi-Fi Move function will be automatically disabled.
4. Click [Save](#) to make the settings effective.

### 3. 2. 2. Soft Pair

You can use the Soft Pair feature to pair this device with other powerline devices to form a powerline network, or leave a powerline network.

- **To form a powerline network.**
  1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
  2. Go to [Powerline > Soft Pair](#).

**Note:** You can set up a powerline network by pushing the Pair button, using the Soft Pair feature, or manually setting the same [powerline network name](#) for each device.

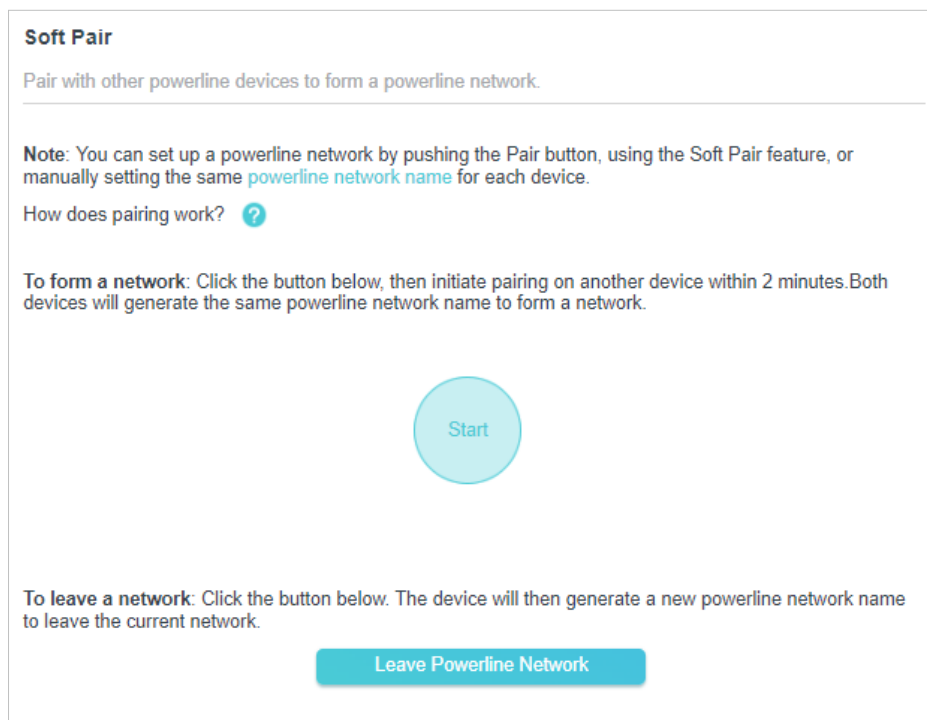


3. Click the **Start** button to initiate pairing on another device within 2 minutes. Both devices will generate the same powerline network name to form a network.

- **To leave a powerline network.**

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.

2. Go to **Powerline > Soft Pair**.



3. Click the **Leave Powerline Network** button. The device will then generate a new powerline network name to leave the current network.

### 3.2.3. Compatibility Mode

You can optimize the network communication of VDSL equipment in the powerline network. Automatic Compatibility is recommended in most cases.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.

2. Go to **Powerline > Compatibility Mode**, and enable it as needed.

**Compatibility Mode**

Optimize the network communication of VDSL equipment in the powerline network. Automatic Compatibility is recommended in most cases.

### 3.3. Wi-Fi Move

Wi-Fi Move is enabled by default. With the feature enabled, any changes made to the Wi-Fi settings of one powerline extender will be automatically synchronized to other powerline extenders whose Wi-Fi Move feature is also enabled on the same powerline network .

Follow the steps below to enable the Wi-Fi Move feature:

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi Move**.
3. Toggle **On** to enable the feature.

Note: Wi-Fi Move function synchronizes all Wi-Fi Settings, LED Schedule and Reboot Schedule. Please note that if the factory default **Powerline Network Name**, i.e. HomeGrid, is being used, the Wi-Fi Move feature will be automatically disabled.

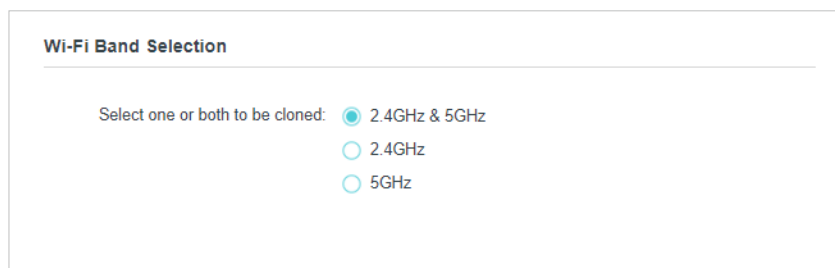
**Note:**

When Wi-Fi Move is enabled, the following features will be synced: Wireless SSID & Password, Wireless Security, Wireless Mode, Wireless Radio Status, Wi-Fi Schedules, LED Schedules, Wi-Fi Clone Settings, MAC Filter Settings, Parental Controls and Guest Network.

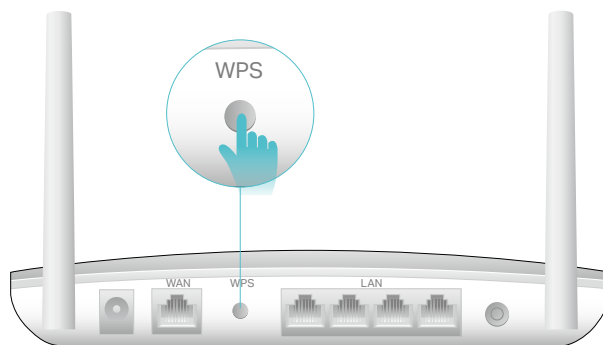
### 3.4. Wi-Fi Clone

You can copy wireless settings from your router to the extender, so you can use the same SSID and password to access the internet in your house.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi Clone**.
3. Select a Wi-Fi band or both to be cloned. **2.4GHz & 5GHz** is selected by default.



4. Before cloning, make sure your router supports the same band as your extender. If you do not know how to check this, go to your router's User Guide for more information.
5. Plug your extender near your router.
6. Press the **WPS** button on your router.

7. Within two minutes, press the **Wi-Fi** button on the side panel of the extender. When the corresponding Wi-Fi LED blinks quickly for 3 seconds and then stays on. It's done!

## 3. 5. Wireless Network

### 3. 5. 1. Customize Wireless Settings

The powerline extender's wireless network name (SSID) and password, and security option are preset in the factory. The preset SSID and password can be found on the product label and Wi-Fi Info Card. You can customize the wireless settings according to your needs.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Wi-Fi > Wireless Settings** page.

- **To enable or disable the wireless function:**

Select the box to enable the wireless Radio of 2.4GHz or 5GHz. Deselect the box to disable wireless function. If disabled, all wireless settings will be ineffective.

- **To change the wireless network name (SSID) and wireless password:**

The default SSID is TP-Link\_XXXX for 2.4GHz network and TP-Link\_XXXX\_5G for 5GHz network, and the default password is printed on the label at the side

panel of the extender. You can change the default ones by directly entering new ones in the field. SSID is up to 32 characters, and the value in both SSID and password is case-sensitive.

**Note:**

Remember to write down the new SSID and password, for you may be disconnected when new settings are effective.

- **To hide SSID:**

Select Hide SSID, and your SSID will not be broadcasted. It won't display when you scan for local wireless network list on your wireless device and you need to manually join the network.

- **To change other settings**

**Security:** Select an option from the Security drop-down list. The extender provides three options, No Security, WPA/WPA2 Personal (Recommended), and WEP. WPA2 uses the newest standard and the security level is the highest. We don't recommend you to change the default settings unless necessary.

**Channel:** Select the channel you want to use from the drop-down list. This field determines which operating frequency will be used. It is not necessary to change the wireless channel unless you notice interference problems with another nearby access point.

**Mode:** Select the desired mode from the dropdown list.


**Channel Width:** Select the channel width. The default setting is Auto, which can adjust the channel width for your clients automatically.

**Transmit Power:** Select the level of transmit power. We recommend you choose High to have the best signal strength.

### 3.5.2. Wireless Clients

Follow the steps below to view detailed information of all wireless clients connected to the extender.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Wi-Fi > Clients** page.

## 3.6. Schedule Your Wireless Function

You can automatically turn off your wireless network at times when you do not need the wireless connection.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net> and log in with the password you set.
2. Go to [Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi Schedule](#).

3. Toggle **On** to enable the Wi-Fi Scheduler. If you are prompted like the following picture, click **Continue**.

4. Check the box of **Do not turn off Wi-Fi while clients are connected to it**.
5. Click **Add** to add an entry.
6. Choose the time period from the drop-down list and check the days.

## 3.7. Parental Controls

## 3.8. Guest Network

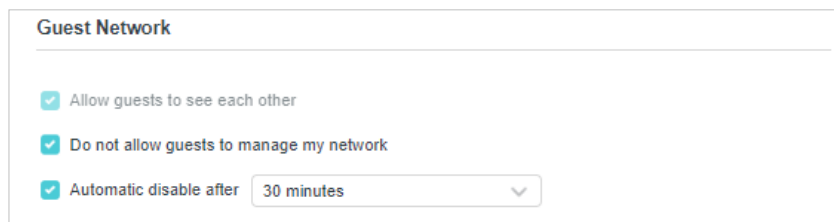
**You can** create a network for your guests, providing internet access for them while at the same time limit the network authorities for guests to ensure network security and privacy.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.

2. Go to **Wi-Fi > Guest Network**.

3. Check the box of relative entry to limit network authorities. If you have problems understanding these items, click the question mark on the upper right corner to have more information.

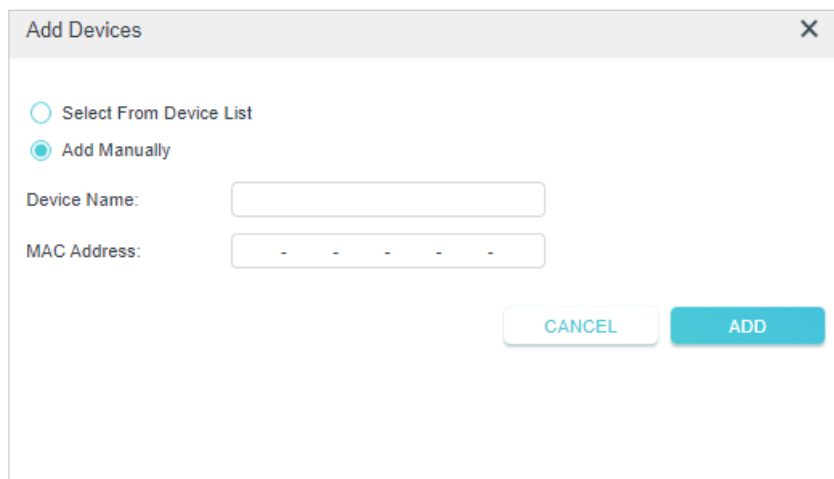

- **To change the guest network name (SSID) and password:**



The default SSID is TP-Link\_Guest\_XXXX for 2.4GHz guest network and TP-Link\_Guest\_XXXX\_5G for 5GHz guest network. The default password is the same as the host network's, which is printed on the label at the back panel of the extender. You can change the default ones by directly entering new ones in the field. SSID is up to 32 characters, and the value in both SSID and password is case-sensitive.

## 3.9. MAC Filter

This function exploits the uniqueness of the MAC (Medium Access Control) address, a unique 12-digit hexadecimal address (for example, D8-5D-4C-B4-46-EA) of every network device, to determine if the device can or cannot access your wireless network.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Wi-Fi** > **MAC Filter**.
3. Toggle **On** to enable MAC Filter.
4. Select either of the filtering rules.

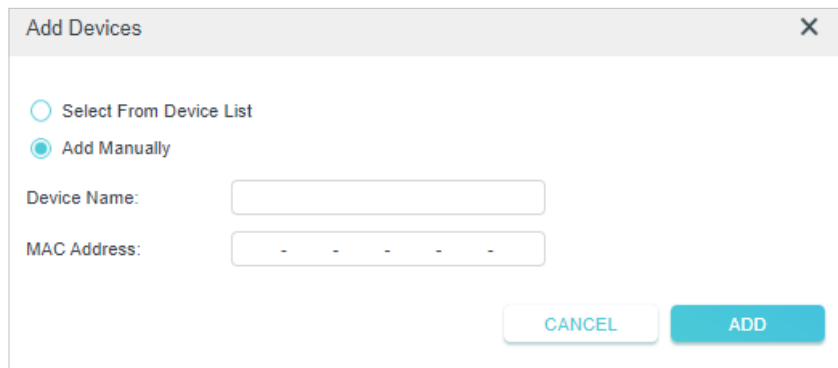

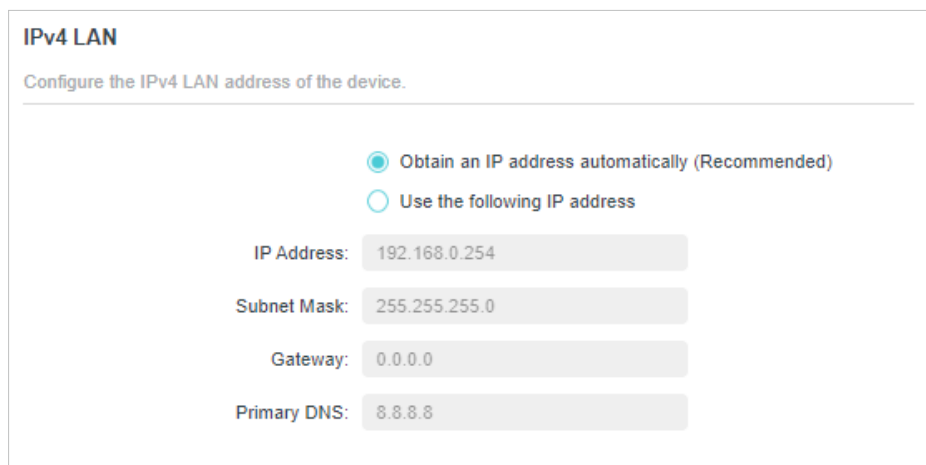

## 3. 10. Network

### 3. 10. 1. LAN Settings

Follow the steps below to configure LAN settings of the extender.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Network > LAN Settings**.

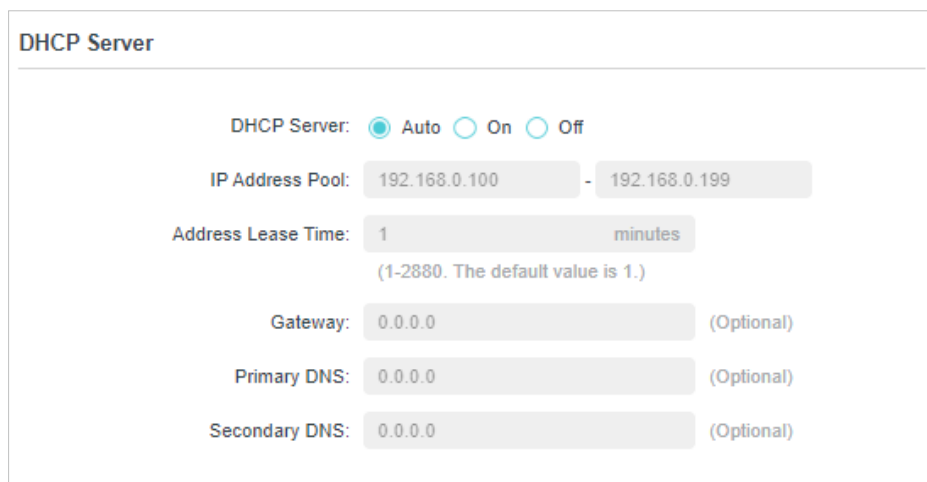

### 3. 10. 2. DHCP Server

Follow the steps below to configure DHCP Server of the extender.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Network > DHCP Server**. Select the DHCP server type and configure the settings. If you select **Auto**, the DHCP server of this extender will be turned off if there is already a DHCP server in the network.

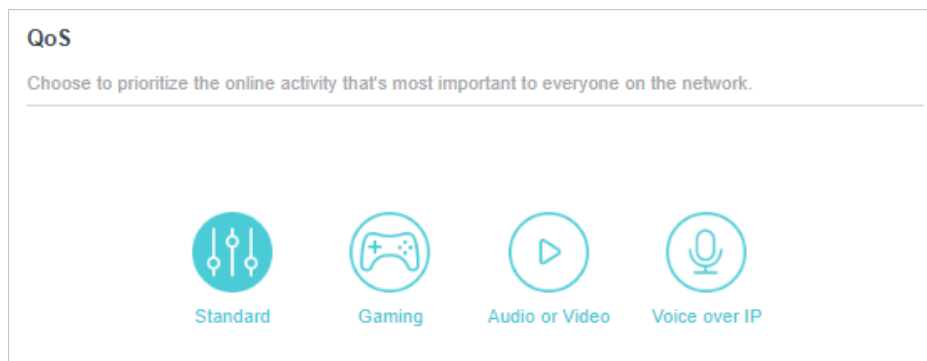


### 3. 10. 3. QoS

You can choose to prioritize the online activity that's most important to everyone on the network.

Follow the steps below to configure the QoS feature of the extender.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to **Network > QoS**. Select the QoS mode to prioritize the corresponding activity.



## 3. 11. System

### 3. 11. 1. LED Control

The LED of the extender indicates its activities and status. You can enable the Night Mode feature to specify a time period during which the LED is off.

1. Connect to the powerline extender wirelessly. Visit <http://tplinkplc.net>, and log in with the password you set for the extender.
2. Go to [System](#) > [LED Control](#) page. Toggle On LED Status.

### 3. 11. 2. Set Up System Time
